CALL FOR FACULTY PARTICIPANTS B.A. Degree in Transatlantic Studies

Course Designers Needed

As part of a Title VI grant from the U.S. Department of Education, seven institutions in the University System of Georgia* are developing an interdisciplinary undergraduate degree in Transatlantic Studies. Degree courses will be offered in an online format to accommodate the consortium arrangement.

Duties: Faculty from participating institutions are sought to be part of interdisciplinary teams designing ten new online courses, focusing on Transatlantic Relations and:

- Africa
- Asia and the Pacific
- Russia and Eurasia
- The Middle East
- The Americas

- Environment and Energy
- Health and Welfare
- Trade and Economics
- Religion and Culture
- Global Security

Selected faculty will be part of a four-person team (one member from each academic discipline: Arts & Humanities, Social Sciences, Business & Economics, Natural & Health Sciences) designing one of the ten courses.

Qualifications: Full-time faculty at the seven participating universities who have expertise and/or experience in any of the course areas. Faculty can apply from *any* discipline. Knowledge of the European Union is not mandatory. Foreign language competence in Spanish or French is preferred but not required. Background in online learning is advantageous. Applicants will be considered without regard to race, color, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, age, veteran status, political affiliation or disability. An honorarium of \$1,000 will be paid annually (for three years) and travel costs for mandatory annual workshops will be covered.

Application: Submit a letter of interest that identifies your qualifications to design one of the above courses in Transatlantic Studies. This letter should be accompanied with a curriculum vita. A separate letter should be sent by your immediate supervisor (department head or dean) expressing his/her willingness allowing you to become involved in the project and evaluating your ability to fulfill the expected duties. The deadline, based on postmark, is **November 1, 2007**. Send all material to:
